General Safety – Health Provisions

29 CFR 1926.20: General safety and health provisions.

General Safety Rules

29 CFR 1926.21, Title: Safety training and education, paragraph (b)(2), states: “The employer shall instruct each employee in the recognition and avoidance of unsafe conditions and the regulations applicable to his work environment to control or eliminate any hazards or other exposure to illness or injury.”

In addition to the various standards that apply to specific job tasks, OSHA has established general safety rules that apply in all cases. **We will abide by these rules.**

Contractor requirements.

We will not require any employee to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous, or dangerous to his/her health or safety.

Accident prevention responsibilities.

We will initiate and maintain safety programs, policies and procedures, and training to meet our contractor requirements.

We will designate competent persons to perform frequent and regular inspections of the job sites, materials, and equipment.

As a matter of company policy, the use of any machinery, tool, material, or equipment which is not in compliance with any requirement of OSHA or other applicable standards is prohibited.

Any machine, tool, material, or equipment found to be unsafe will either be identified as unsafe by tagging or locking the controls to render them inoperable or will be physically removed from its place of operation.

We will permit only those employees qualified by training or experience to operate equipment and machinery.
